Pediatrician's Corner Podcast A Conversation with a Pediatric Hematologist

In this podcast, pediatric hematologist Dr. Clay Cohen and general pediatrician Dr. Nisha Rathore discuss some of the most common questions around hematology in pediatrics. Their conversation explores how to identify and evaluate patients at high-risk for iron deficiency – both infants and toddlers, as well as adolescents. They discuss key principles for the accurate interpretation of complete blood counts (CBCs) and share guidance on when CBC results warrant a hematology referral. Finally, they cover the topic of abnormal bleeding symptoms: when to be concerned, differential diagnoses, and the role of family history. This conversation closes the gap between the specialized knowledge of a pediatric hematologist and the frontline clinical care of the general pediatrician.
