Pediatrician's Corner Podcast A Conversation with a Pediatric Allergist

In this podcast, pediatric allergist Dr. Stukus and general pediatrician Dr. Khan discuss some of the most common questions around food allergy in pediatrics. Their conversation explores often-overlooked recommendations for the early introduction of allergenic foods, practices to prevent the development of food allergy, and how to pursue an accurate food allergy diagnosis. They discuss the role of maternal diet while breastfeeding in food allergy prevention, updated recommendations and guidelines pediatricians should be aware of, and hot topics in the world of food allergy. This conversation closes the gap between the specialized knowledge of a pediatric allergist and the frontline clinical care of the general pediatrician.
